RULE INFORMATION

Rules for movable obstructions 15.2.

Artificial and easily movable objects such as a rake or rubbish can be moved if

they interfere with your stance or swing.

If your ball moves you are able to replace your ball and play on.

This includes bunkers.

Loose impediments like twigs leaves and rocks are different.

If you move them and your ball moves you must replace your ball and add 1

penalty stroke.

You are not allowed to move the tee markers.
