
MONTHLY WINNERS

TURNPOINT GOLF COURSE WORKS

Background: There was a meeting with Turnpoint on 29 May 2025 to provide an update on the course works.

5th FAIRWAY

The construction of the new green on the fairway was well progressed. It has a swale in front of it to provide shape and avoid playing to a green sloping away from the tee. With input from the Lady golfers, playing to a Par 3, it was decided to modify the front garden to reduce the time required looking for lost balls. Work was expected to be completed that day.





The green has incorporated some material from the sacrificed 8th green but there will be a requirement to sow new seed on some parts recognising that we are entering winter and growth will be slow. After discussion it was agreed to plan on the basis that the new green would not be playable before December 2025. Matt Partridge's advised that given field sizes it will be sensible and reasonable to play the current lay out until that time i.e. playing the 5th hole as is and the 2nd/8th twice.

For the next two weeks we will play from the temporary teeing area on the right of the fairway whilst the works bed down. The area will be marked with flags/tape to ensure no entry is made and will be treated as GUR.



NEW 5th TEE

This has been constructed adjacent to the current 17th tee. Although it is also unlikely to be ready for use until December.

6th GREEN

Justin Trott recommended that a channel be cut into the green to allow for an 'agi-pipe' type



drain to be installed so that moisture can be drained into the pond.

Some turf from the sacrificed 8th green will be used as well as grass seed that Justin recommended.

This portion of the green will be marked as GUR until it is restored.

9th TEE

The new tee area, on the other side of the path to the 18th tee, was being built on the afternoon of the 29th and morning of the 30th.

Matt Kearney has some kikuyu turf for this area.

PATH FROM REDESIGNED 8th GREEN TO THE 9th TEE

If required earlier, players should be directed to walk from the second tee (after tee shots have been played by that group) on the eastern side of the fairway with the group playing the second hole.

At the fairway bell peel away to the 9th tee while the other group plays out the second green.

Balls being played from both the 1st and 2nd tees are in clear view.

NOTE FROM STU CASSIE

All golfers as the changes are occurring on the 5th hole please not that the new green and surrounds are GUR for the next few months, a temporary tee is set up to the left hand side of the new green area we will be playing this for the next 2

weeks.

If all goes well then we might shift back to the original 5th tee box in a few weeks the hole will stay as a par 4, Sorry for the inconvenience but the changes to the hole will mean we get back to playing 18 holes again by hopefully December or earlier.
